- Themes and goals:** The seminar aims to facilitate cooperation and partnership among institutions delivering programmes in the fields of adult and vocational education. Participants from different European countries will be encouraged to come together to formulate and exchange ideas and to develop partnerships for change and transition, with a particular focus on how institutions from different countries might collaborate with a view to improving and enhancing their responsiveness in three key priority areas for Erasmus+, namely: inclusion and diversity, digital transformation and environmental and climate change. Funding opportunities will be introduced and **participants will have the opportunity to begin working on possible project ideas for submission in the next Erasmus+ Call for Proposals (2022).**
